Kota: Ramen is also popular. Tonkotsu ramen, especially, is very famous. It was created in Fukuoka in 1937.

*John* : Oh, really? I know about *ramen*, but what is *tonkotsu*?

Kota: Tonkotsu refers to pork bones. The pork bones are cooked for a long time to create a thick, white soup. The soup is rich and creamy, and it's very popular in Japan and other countries.

*John* : I want to try that! Is there a *ramen* restaurant around here?

*Kota*: Yes. Have you seen ② the restaurant with a red door and a dragon statue at the entrance? It's between the flower shop and the cake shop near our school.

Kota: I've been there a few times. The ramen is really good, so it's often crowded.We might need to wait to enter the restaurant because it's a popular place. Is4) that okay?



Hello, everyone! Today, I want to talk about some amazing libraries around the world. I love libraries, and I always go there when I have free time. Libraries have a long history, and I hope you can also find a library you'd like to visit!

Libraries have been important for a very long time. The oldest library was in Syria about 4000 years ago. Libraries have always kept books and information safe for everyone.

One great thing about libraries is the special feeling we get when we visit them. For example, the National Library in Austria is one of the most beautiful libraries in the world. It has a big hall, a beautiful dome, and a lot of paintings on the walls. Visiting this library feels like stepping into a fairy tale. This library even has sheet music written by Mozart and Beethoven!

The largest library in the world is the Library of Congress in the United States. The library built in 1800 has over 170 million books and items in 470 languages. If you lined up all its bookshelves, they would stretch about 1350 kilometers—the distance from Sapporo to Shimonoseki!

There are also beautiful libraries in Japan. For example, the library at Akita International University uses a lot of Akita cedar wood. Its roof has a unique shape like an umbrella. The Wakayama Civic Library is also special. With ①stylish furniture, we can relax and read books. The warmth of the wood and the smell of books are something you can't get from the Internet.

Some people think libraries will become more digital in the future. Many libraries already have books available online, so people can read from anywhere. But even if ②this happens, I think regular libraries will still be important. In Finland, people use libraries to meet, talk, share ideas and create new things together. 
